1. Beth Medrash Govoha hereby acknowledges that the institution signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, \$2,949,797 designated under the CRRSAA (a) (1) program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. The institution has received or will receive \$2,949,797 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to eligible students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program as of 3/31/2021 is \$734,990.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program is 7,158 students.
5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program as of 3/31/2021 is: 872 students.
6. The following are the method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they receive under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program during Fall 2020.

**FALL 2020 BUDGETS FOR CALCULATION OF CARES ACT GRANT**

The following are baseline budget models for student expenses related emergency aid due to Covid19 disruption. Actual grants will be made using the institution's allocation policy.

**Dependent students and independent students with no dependents or spouse:** No allocation at this time, as in-person instruction is now permitted, and on-campus dormitory housing is open with appropriate health and safety provisions in place. Policy may be updated should circumstances change.

**Budget for Independent student with dependents including spouse:** Food and non-food/household items including health care products - \$1,300, assistance with housing costs – \$1,100.

**Institutional Allocation Policy:** Due to the Covid19 disruption, some Independent students with dependents including spouse may experience reductions and losses in other resources and

support, which would have helped cover basic living expenses - food, housing, etc. The institution will provide HEERF funds to enable students in this category to cover their food, housing, and material costs in an amount estimated to equal to other resources they might have had access to if not for the Covid19 disruption, up to a maximum of 2,400.

7. The following are the instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

Students received letters specifying the use of CARES grants as follows:

*Cares is meant to help with cost of attendance expenses due to disruption of campus operations from Covid19 (including food, rent, books, childcare, transportation, etc.).*
